

There are lots of other things for you to get involved in and we look forward to seeing many of you at the events we have planned over the coming weeks. Our new pupils have all settled so well and it was wonderful to see so many current and prospective parents on our recent open morning too. We really hope you got a feel for the school and all the fantastic work your children have been doing so far this year.

There are many coughs and colds about at this time of year and of course you are the best judge of whether your child is well enough to attend. However, we would appreciate you supporting us with raising and maintaining good school attendance, which can often dip during this term. Please do send children if they are well enough and should we feel they deteriorate as the day goes on, we will always call you. It's often the case that they perk up once in school and are busy playing with friends and learning. Our target for attendance is to stay above the government's recommended threshold of 95% and we would welcome your support to achieve this.

Thank you to those of you who used the uniform guidance to support purchasing the correct uniform over the holidays ready for starting back in school. It is important that where guidance and policies are in place that these are followed. It sets the correct expectations we have of all our pupils in all aspects of their time with us in school. If you do have any need for additional uniform to support you financially and for sustainability and to support the environmental benefits of recycling, please let us know in school. We have some donated good quality uniform and a small selection of this will be available at the Xmas jumper sale on Friday, so do bring a bag and collect some spare sets or something in the next size. It is essential for all pupils to have the correct uniform and equipment - reading books, homework and PE kit etc - on the correct days. And finally, a huge thank you and warm welcome to those parents and extended family who have come forward to volunteer their time in school. It is always very much appreciated and we hope that it is of mutual benefit to us and to you if you volunteer your time with us.




Following the recent investigations about the use of RAAC in public buildings, a survey was commissioned by Leeds Diocese who have responsibility for our school building here at Denby.
